Human capital development on agenda for EEF

One of the topics for discussion at the upcoming EEF is the development of human capital. The Forum has scheduled a panel discussion entitled Securing human resources for investors: "A turnkey solution".

The Russian Far East has encountered a labour deficit. According to Valentin Timakov, head of the Agency for the Development of Human Capital in the Far East, the region's future economic development is contingent on marked employment growth across a number of sectors. By 2021, new businesses in the advanced special economic zones (ASEZs) and the Vladivostok Free Port will create more than 47,000 jobs. Yury Trutnev: Governors must play a leading role in the development of free ports

At a session of the Subcommittee on the implementation of investment projects in the Russian Far East and Baikal region, Yury Trutnev tasked the attending governors of the Far Eastern regions to begin work on managing the free ports.

"The Ministry for the Development of the Far East and I personally oversee the Supervisory Board of the Vladivostok Free Port. We need to consider in detail and very quickly, so as not to lose momentum, how to organize the system of governance of each territory," Trutnev said. According to the presidential envoy, it is the governors who should play the leading role in the free ports' development. "I urge them to ready themselves for this responsibility. I will make visits and inquiries. We will work side by side. But to ensure that governance is effective, it needs active leadership. The burden of developing the regions is growing constantly. Senators vote for investment quotas for the development of the fishing industry

The Federation Council approved a draft amendment to the Law On Fisheries and Conservation of Aquatic Biological Resources as well as other legal acts of the Russian Federation that seek to improve the distribution of catching (yield) quotas from aquatic bio-resources. As a result of the vote, the bill will now be passed on for signing by the President.

The amendment will see a new mechanism for developing the fishing industry enter into effect – catching (yield) quotas from aquatic bio-resources will be tied to investment targets.

An investor who obtains fishing rights now takes on the obligation to purchase Russian vessels or create fish-processing facilities. In this manner, the introduction of quotas will facilitate the renewal of the fleet and the modernisation of littoral infrastructure.

Benefits on mineral extraction tax for investors in the Russian Far East to enter into effect on 1 July

A law granting tax benefits to investors in the Russian Far East who have invested RUB 50 million or more into facilities in the Far Eastern Federal District will enter into effect as of 1 July 2016. Far East Development Fund to allocate RUB 4.6 billion for three new projects

The Russian Government Subcommittee on the implementation of investment projects in the Russian Far East has selected another three investment projects to receive funding from the Far East Development Fund, said Yury Trutnev.

Priority financing from FEDF funds will see RUB 1.8 billion go to the logistics hub of Russian Post in Khabarovsk Territory (with a total investment volume of RUB 5.7 billion), RUB 2.14 billion to the construction of second and third plants for deep soy refining in the

Belogorsk ASEZ (with a total investment volume of RUB 5.8 billion), and RUB 630 million for the Ozerny ore mining and processing facility for the construction of transportation infrastructure (with a total investment volume of RUB 72.9 billion). Nevertheless, the final decision on the Ozerny ore mining and processing facility has been postponed: "The project provides for the exploitation of lead-zinc ore located close to Lake Baikal. We need to ascertain whether this deposit is located within the protected area around Lake Baikal," Trutnev said. If no risks are identified, the Ozerny ore mining and processing facility will receive funding. Ministry for the Development of the Russian Far East awaits influx of foreign capital into the ports of the Russian Far East following development of free port regime

The Federation Council has approved amendments to the Federal Law on Advanced Special Economic Zones and the Federal Law on the Vladivostok Free Port.

Under the amendment, the free port regime will be rolled out to Khabarovsk Territory (Vaninsky District), Sakhalin Region (Korsakovsky District), Kamchatka Territory (Petropavlovsk-Kamchatsky), Chukotka Autonomous District (Pevek) and Primorsky Territory (Lazovsky District). http://www.interfax-russia.ru/FarEast/news.asp?id=740302&sec=1679

Resident enterprise at Beringovsky ASEZ to build new solid refuse dump with a capacity of 35 thousand m3 per year in Chukotka

Anadyrskaya Transport Company is to build a new solid refuse dump with a capacity of 35 thousand m3 per year in Chukotka, with a total investment of over RUB 24 million. The agreement on the project was signed on Wednesday by the Far East Development Corporation (the FEDC is the management company of the Vladivostok Free Port and ASEZ projects in the Far East) and Anadyrskaya Transport Company.

In addition to this, the FEDC and ATC signed an agreement to modernise the Anadyr water sanitation plant, a project in which the company plans to invest over RUB 27 million. Once the modernisation is complete, the sanitation process for drinking water will become automated.

Bridge across Lena River to be built over six years

The final protocol signed at a session of the Russian-Chinese Intergovernmental Commission provides for the construction of a bridge across the Lena River over the next six years, with the possibility of being completed sooner.

"Back in 2014, we held talks with Chinese enterprises. The government of Yakutia has done a lot of work to negotiate and draw up the necessary documents. We are developing our cooperation in other areas as well," remarked Alexey Zagorenko, CEO of the Agency for the Investment Development of Yakutia.

Earlier, the Head of the Republic of Sakha Yegor Borisov took part in the third session of the Russia-China Commission for Investment Cooperation in Beijing. Sixty-six joint investment projects worth approximately USD 90 billion in total were examined and included in the final protocol at the event, which was chaired by First Deputy Prime Minister of Russia Igor Shuvalov and Vice Premier of the People's Republic of China Zhang Gaoli.
